I am the 13th child of Will and Rozett Anderson. I always say my history started five years before I was born — when my mother had a special dream and manifestation that she was to mother two more children, a girl and a boy (I am the boy).

Family has always been very important to me, and since becoming better acquainted with this large noble Homer family, I can see much has been accomplished and there is still much to be accomplished.

Some of our goals are:

- Establish a family archives (see article inside).
- Continue work on two books (1) Homer Children Stories, and (2) Descendants of Russel King Homer and Wives. Information for these books is in the process of being gathered—there is still time to provide needed information and pictures. We will not publish the books until we have sufficient pre-sales to finance the books. This money is kept in a separate account, and could be returned if we do not have enough pre-sales.
- Continue research for temple work. In addition to research on ancestral lines, we are working on a project to submit names from Westmoreland Cemetery records for temple work.
- Locate descendants of Russel King Homer. We are very indebted to Gareth Homer who has worked tirelessly on this project, and continues to do so. However, we need everyone's help to accomplish this goal. Do you know any adult Homer descendants who do not receive this newsletter? We need their names and addresses!
 - Hold reunions every five years.

Names for Temple Work

Joseph G. Buttars (of Salt Lake) has entered over 2400 names from the Westmoreland, New Hampshire, cemetery records. In an initial check against the I.G.I., 90% of the names cleared. We will now check them against the TIB, and then they will be ready for submission for temple work. With the new Temple Ready program the names will be available within a week after submission to the temple.

We are looking for family members who would help organize other family members in their temple district. GRANDCHILDREN FOCUS

Benjamin Homer of Yarmouth, Mass.

Benjamin Homer, second son and third of eight children of Captain John Homer and Margery Stevens, was born 8 May 1698 at Boston, Mass., possibly named after his mother's brother, Benjamin Stevens.1 He grew up in a comfortable, maybe affluent home, with the family in Boston.1

When Benjamin was a young man, a merchant, Mr. Stright, in Yarmouth wanted to go into the business of making custom clothing for sailors and wrote to a friend in Boston to send him a qualified tailor. Benjamin moved to Yarmouth to provide these clothes for him.2

There he probably met his bride, Elisabeth Crowell. They were married 22 December 1721 in Yarmouth by Daniel Greenleaf.4

They bought a farm north of Yarmouth and built a house.2 It is thought his house, later moved to South Yarmouth near the Bass River, still stands today at the corner of Main and Mill Streets.7 In the house they had six sons and three daughters, as follows:

- 1. Bethia, born 18 march 1722,5 married Benjamin Cobb of Boston⁶
- 2. John, born 28 Sept. 1724, 5 died 29 Apr. 1799, Barrington, N. S. 6, married 1st: 28 Sep 1749 Abigail Osborn of Nantucket, 6 married 2nd: 2 July 1772, Boston, Hannah Carnes 1.
- 3. Margery, born 13 July 1727.5 Married 1st: 3 January 1765, William Sears of Harwich, Mass. 1 Married 2nd: Higgins6.
- 4. William, born 14 July 1729,5 died 24 Feb. 1764,5 unmarried6 on a voyage from Barbados to Boston.1
- 5. Benjamin, born 5 Aug. 1731, 5 married 23 October 1759, Mary Perrott.6 died 10 Mar. 17765
- 6. Stephens, born 15 April 1734,5 married Elizabeth Chapman of Yarmouth.1
- 7. Thomas, born 21 March 1736,5 "The Valiant Captain"6 married 21 Nov. 1765, Elizabeth Sears of Yarmouth.1
- 8. Elisabeth, born 18 Sep. 1738,5 married David Knowles,3 died 17 Nov. 1812.3
- 9. Robert, born 28 July 1742,5 married 7 Jan. 1768 Jerusha Sears,3 died 1832.3

In their later years, Benjamin and Elisabeth cared for Benjamin's aged mother, Margery, who died in the home about 1762, over 95 years of age.6

At least four of their six sons (John, William, Benjamin, and Thomas) were seamen. October 23, 1776, in Yarmouth, Benjamin died.⁵ Elisabeth died there January 23, 1778.5

Family Archives

Comments by Bill Homer and Gareth Homer

- 1. There should be a central family archives for important documents, photos, etc.
- 2. The archives should be public, permanent and accessible, thus ruling out homes of private family members, specifically one who is located too far from the majority of potentially interested family parties.
- 3. We would suggest the archives be set up in connection with a church branch family history center, where we will be assured there will always be a large pool of family members from which to select an archivist and where there will be sufficient local interest to protect our family's history, materials and interests.
- 4. Our archives should remain under our control, with our own family member archivist called to serve as an assistant librarian with primary responsibility for the Homer collection and the stipulation that if arrangements are not satisfactory, our collection may be removed at our sole discretion and placed elsewhere.
- 5. The family archivist should make copies of documents, photos, etc. available to any family member upon request, retaining the originals in the archives.
- 6. The location of the materials should be conducive to their preservation. The potential for water, heat, light or any other damage should be considered.
